## AN ACT PROTECTING BENEFITS OWED TO CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

S.105 Sen. Comerford / H.227 Rep. Farley-Bouvier



## SUMMARY

This Act ensures children in DCF custody who are eligible for Social Security benefits get them and receive financial literacy training.

## **PROBLEM**

- For years, almost 1,250 children and young adults in DCF custody were stripped from receiving Social Security benefits they were entitled to.
- DCF siphoned about 90% of youth's benefits into the Commonwealth's General Fund. This amounted to about \$500,000 per month, \$5.5 million dollars per year, or less than 0.5% of DCF's proposed FY25 budget negligible to DCF but transformative for youth.
- Without these vital funds, youth aging out of foster care are at risk of serious financial instability, often with devastating results, e.g., homelessness, legal system involvement, and further trauma.

## SOLUTION

- Prevents reversion to this insidious practice even if/when there are economic downturns.
- Ensures children and young adults will receive the benefits they are legally entitled to and are aware of the availability of funds conserved for them by the time they turn 14 years old.
- Supports financial independence for transition-age youth and their caregivers through financial empowerment training and support.
